March is Fraud Prevention Month in Canada. Scammers work harder during the months of March and April because of the busy tax season. Computer use and technology makes it easy to steal people's identity and older adults suffer the greatest loss of money.

The Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre (CAFC) gathers information on fraud and scams affecting older Canadians. They compiled a toolkit designed for older adults and seniors to raise public awareness and prevent victimization.

Health Corner

While March 20th is World Oral Health Day, in Canada, April is National Oral Health Month.

The World Health Organization says over the past three decades, Africa has experienced the most substantial increase in major oral diseases among the organization's six defined regions.

Despite being largely preventable, oral diseases such as tooth cavities, gum disease, and tooth loss pose a significant public health challenge, impacting 44% of the region's inhabitants.
